HOW TO DRAW A HEART

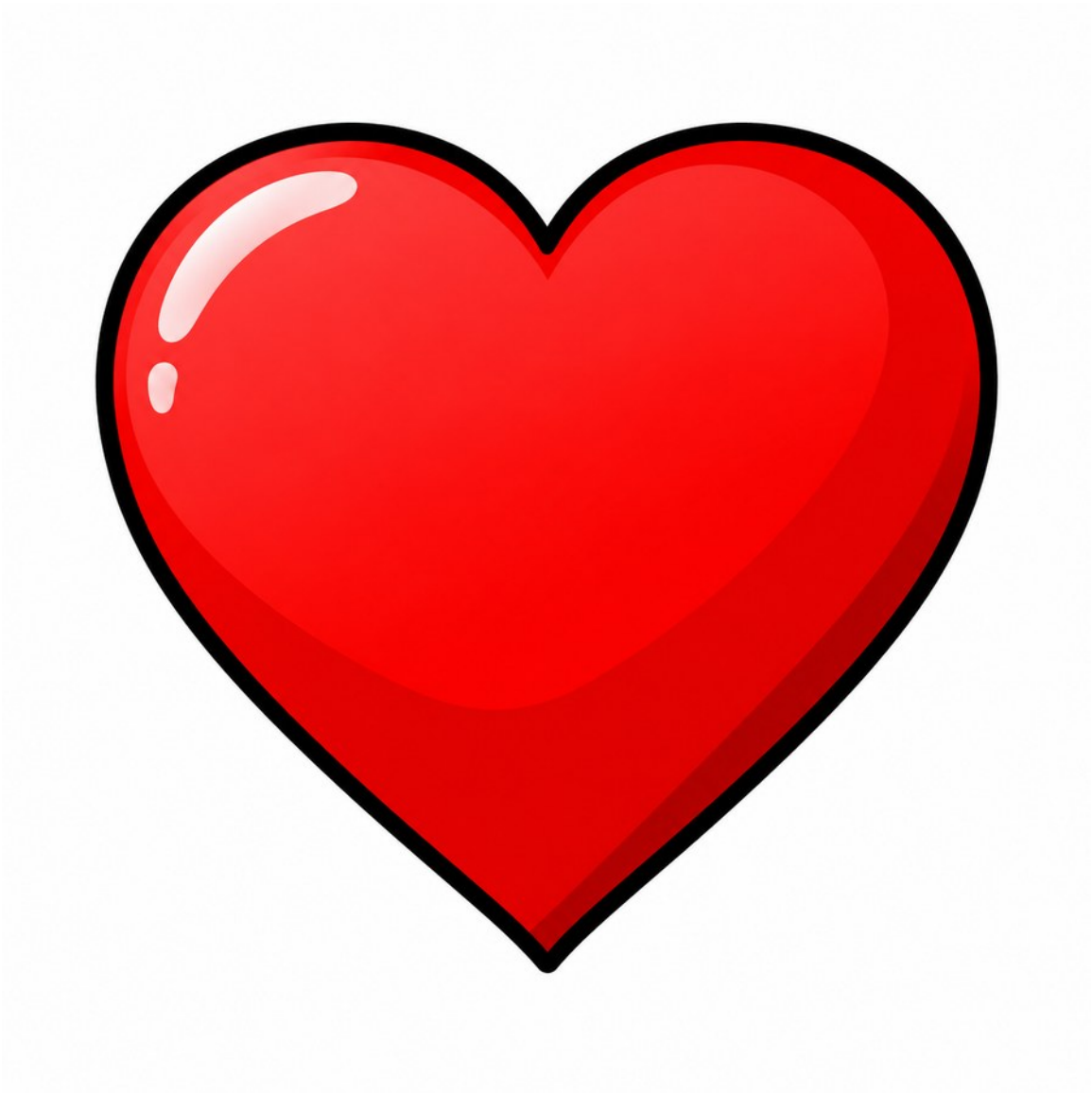
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|----------------------|---|
| 1 Draw a wide V | a soft U-shape for the pointed bottom. |
| 2 Add two bumps | one each side, meeting in a dip at the top. |
| 3 Outline & clean up | even out both sides and erase the guides. |

Tip: fold the paper in half, draw against the fold and cut — instant symmetry.

Each page shows one heart and what it symbolizes — use them as drawing references, flashcards, or tracing pages. Print at 100% on Letter or A4.





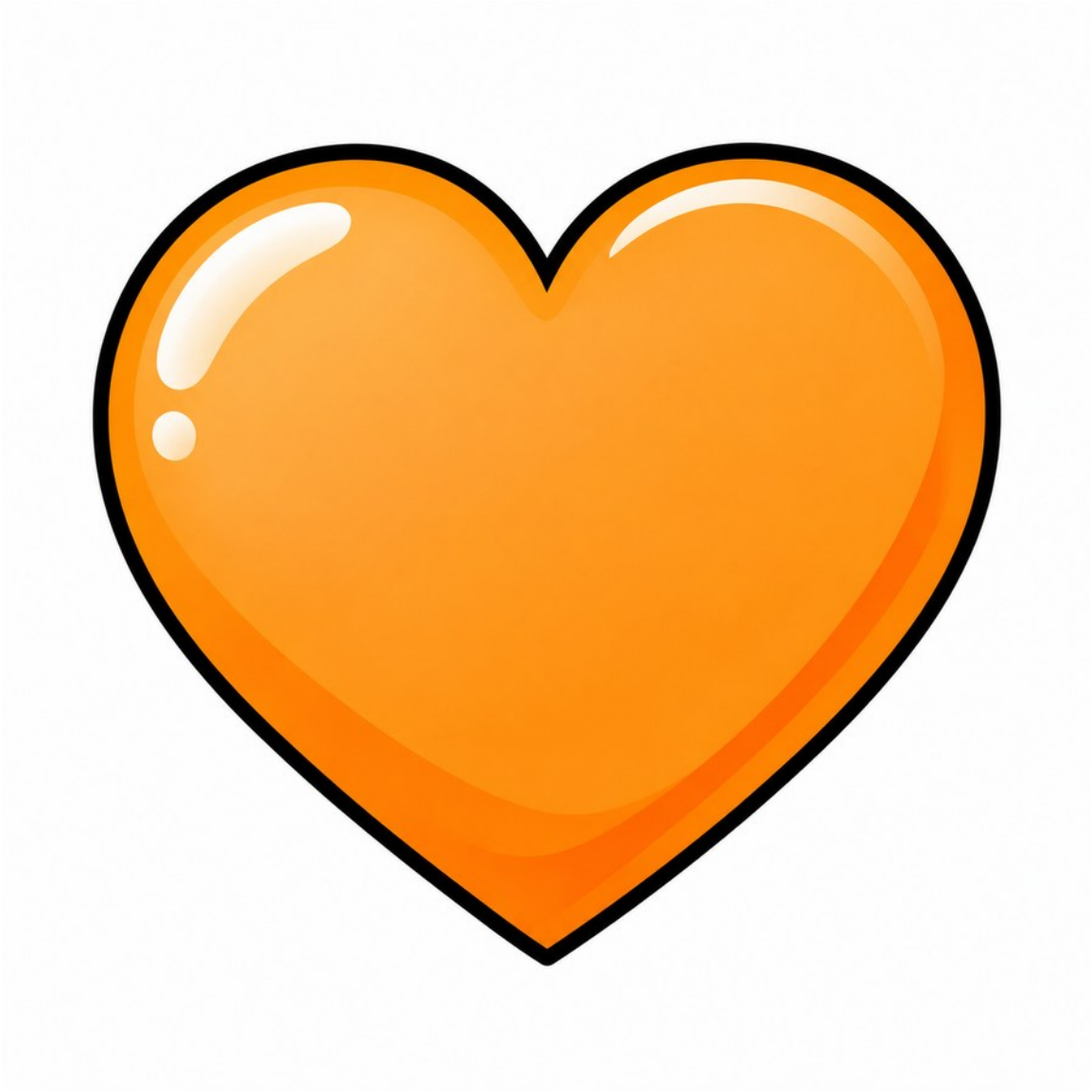
Red Heart

Love, romance and passion — the universal heart.



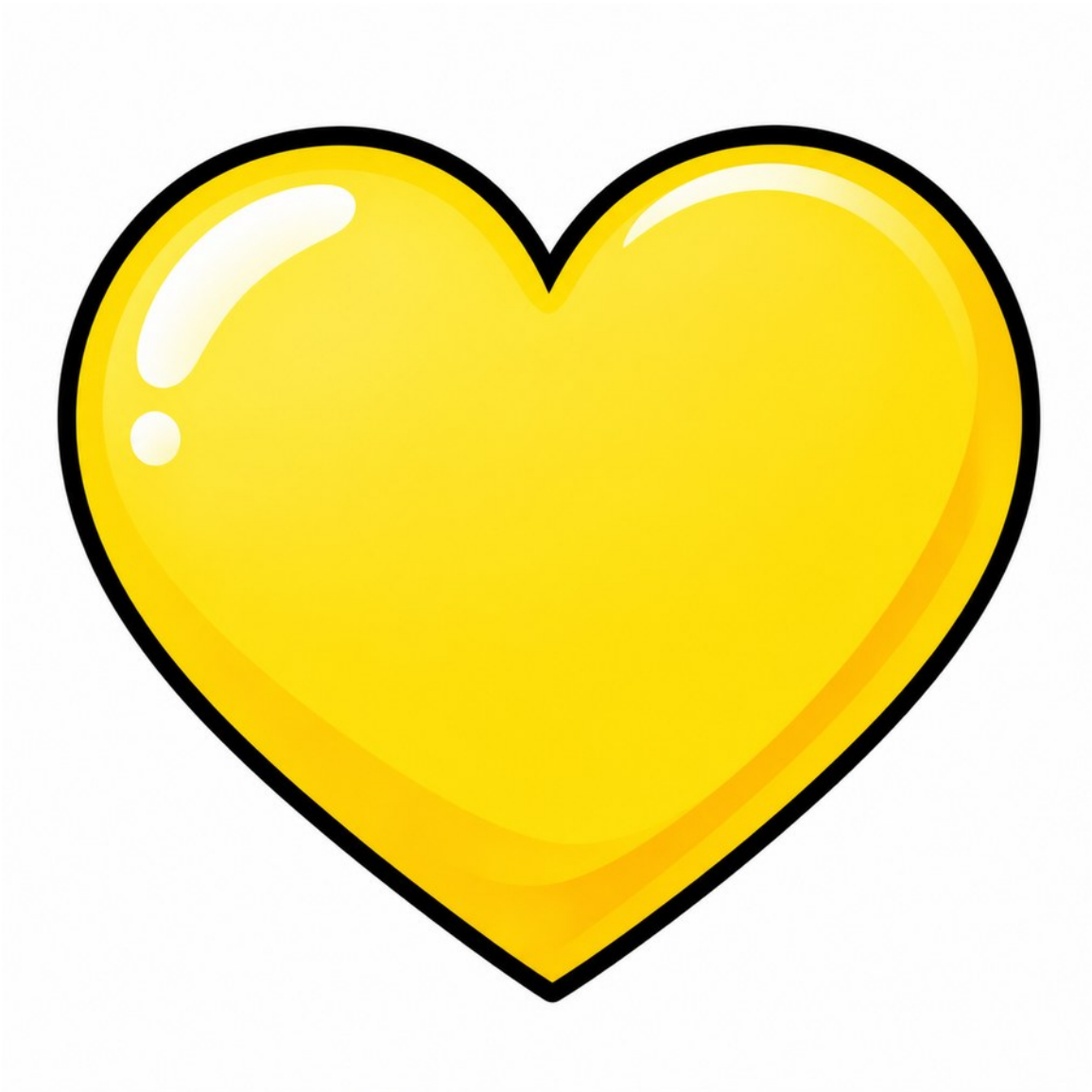
Pink Heart

Friendship, joy and sunshine — best-friend energy.



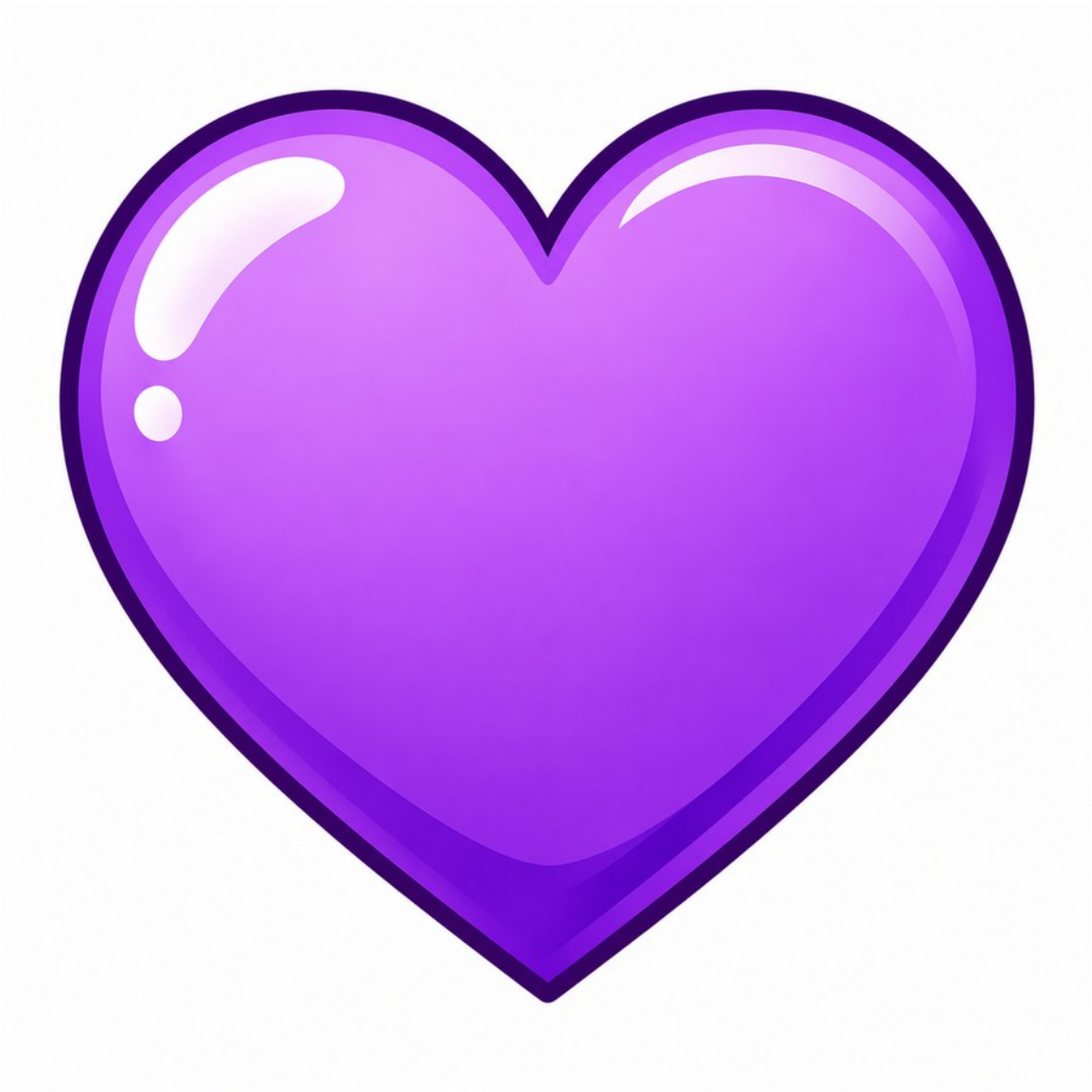
Green Heart

Nature, growth and health (and sometimes jealousy).



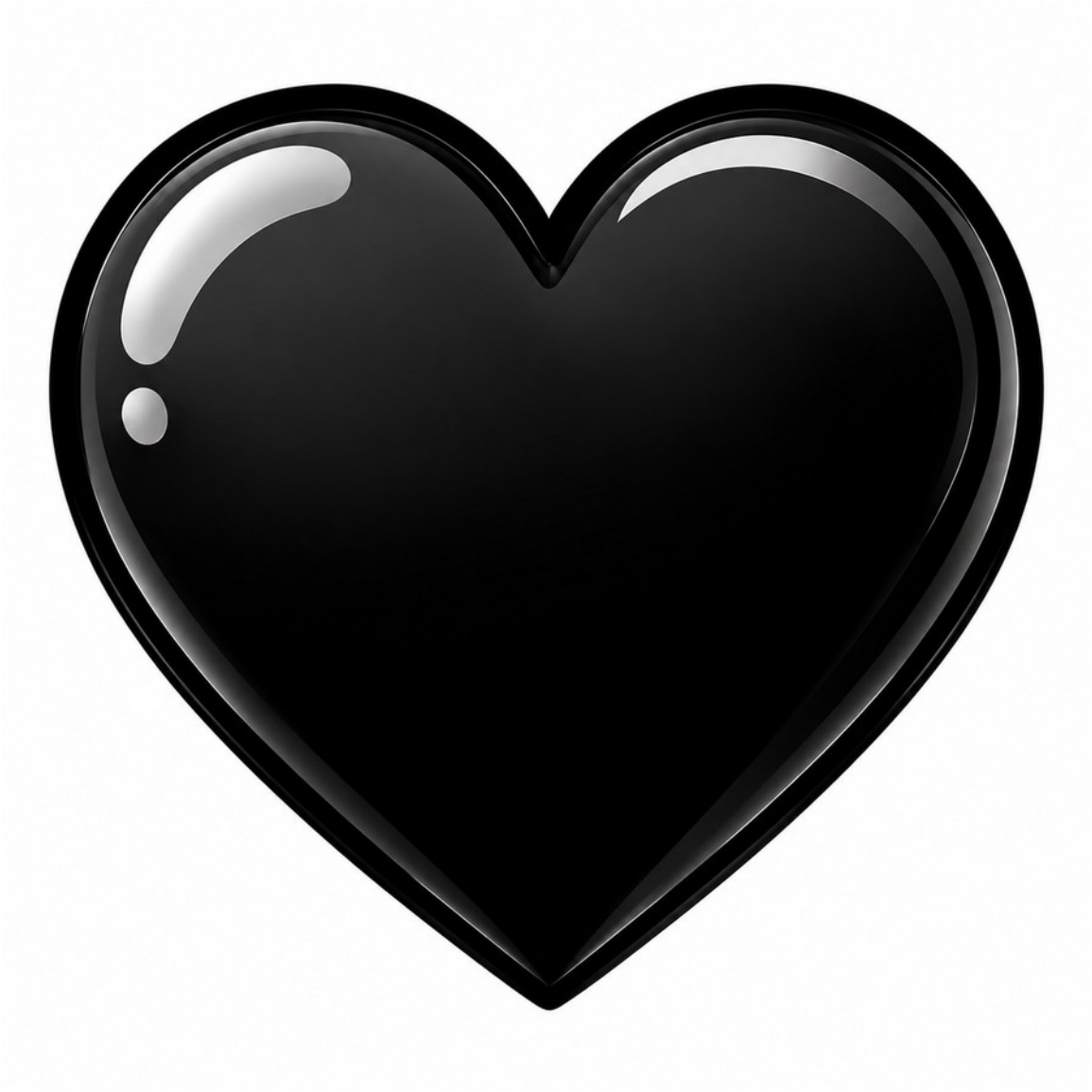
Blue Heart

Trust, loyalty and calm — steady, dependable love.



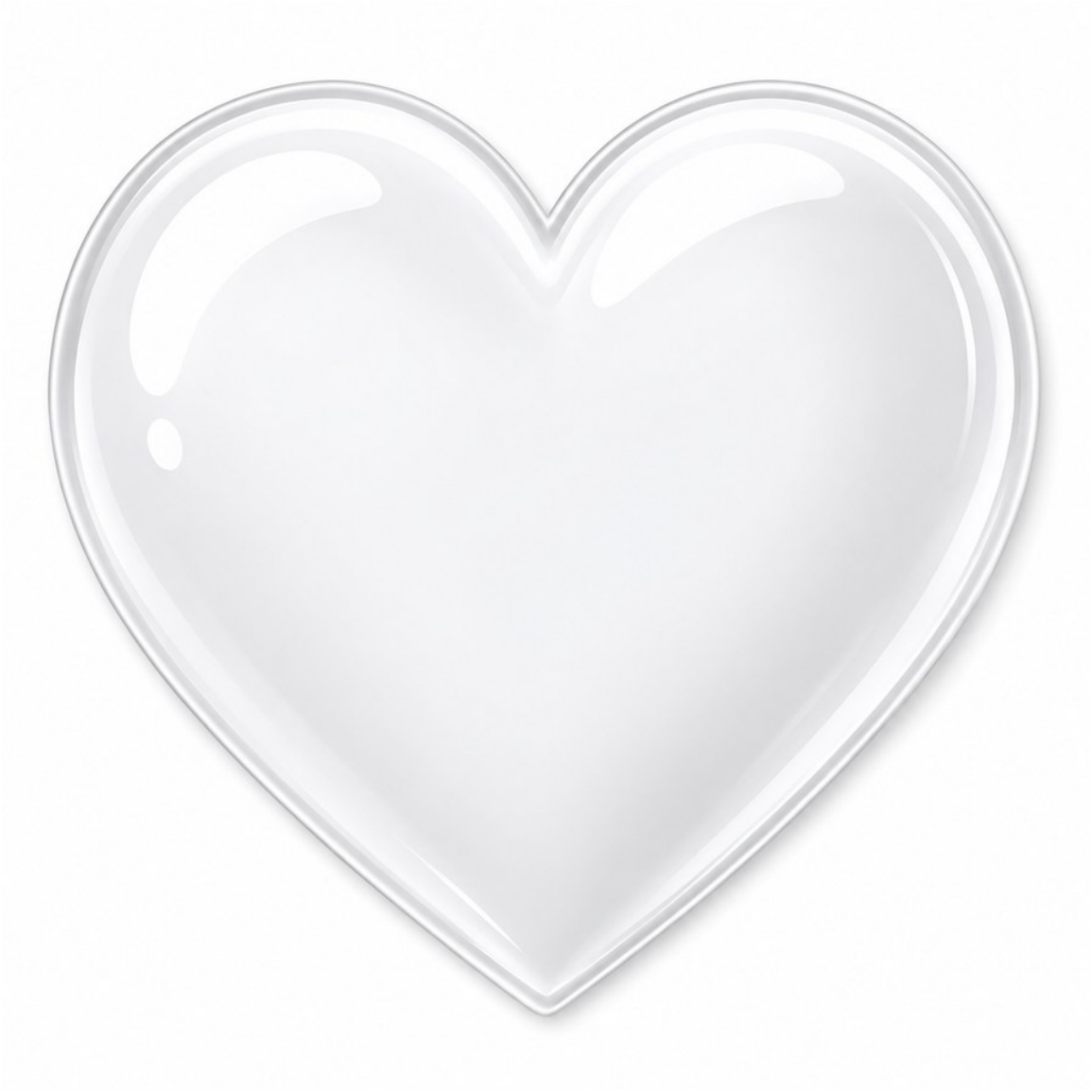
Purple Heart

Grief, dark humor, or an edgy aesthetic.



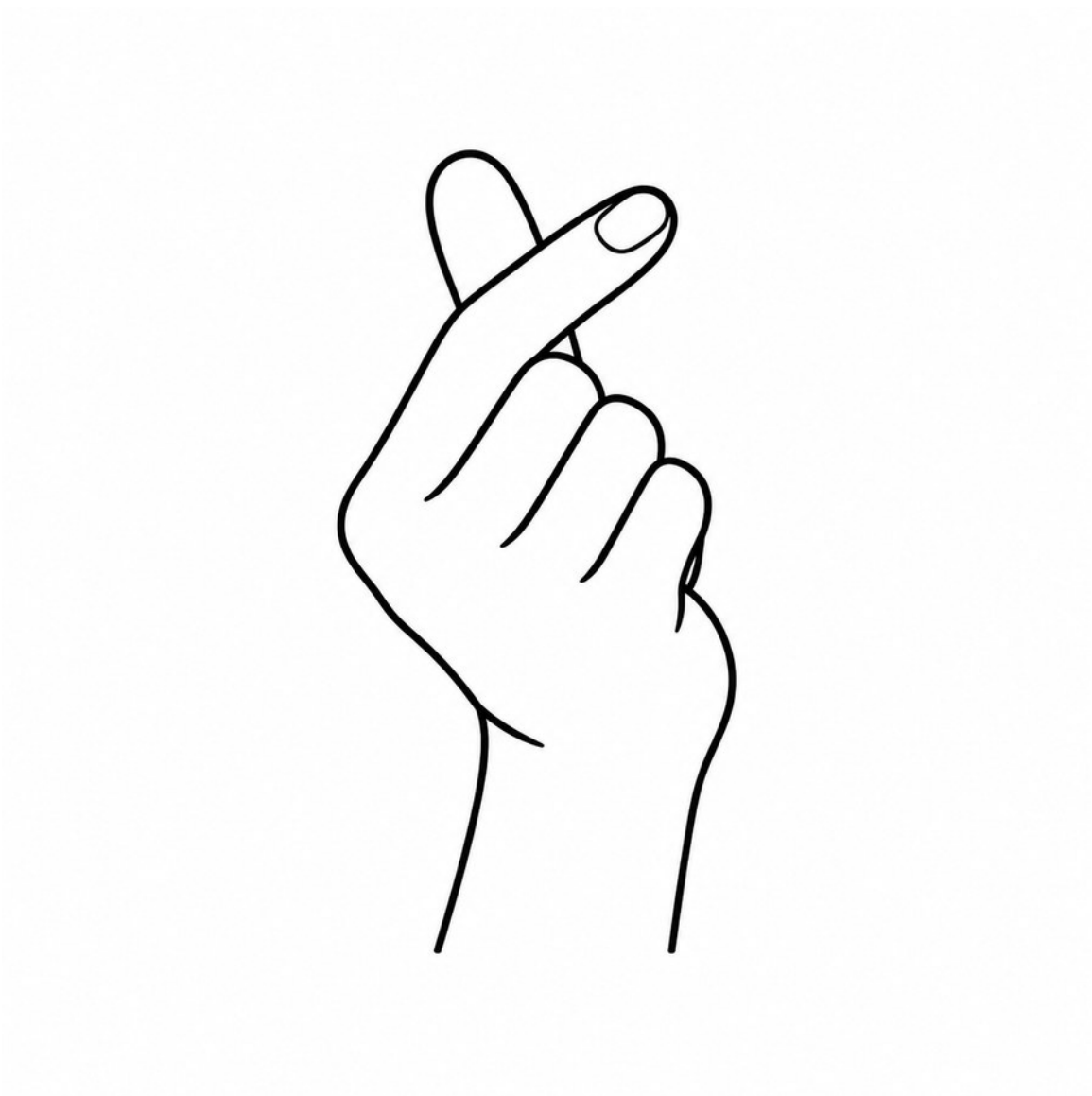
White Heart

Purity, peace, sympathy and remembrance.



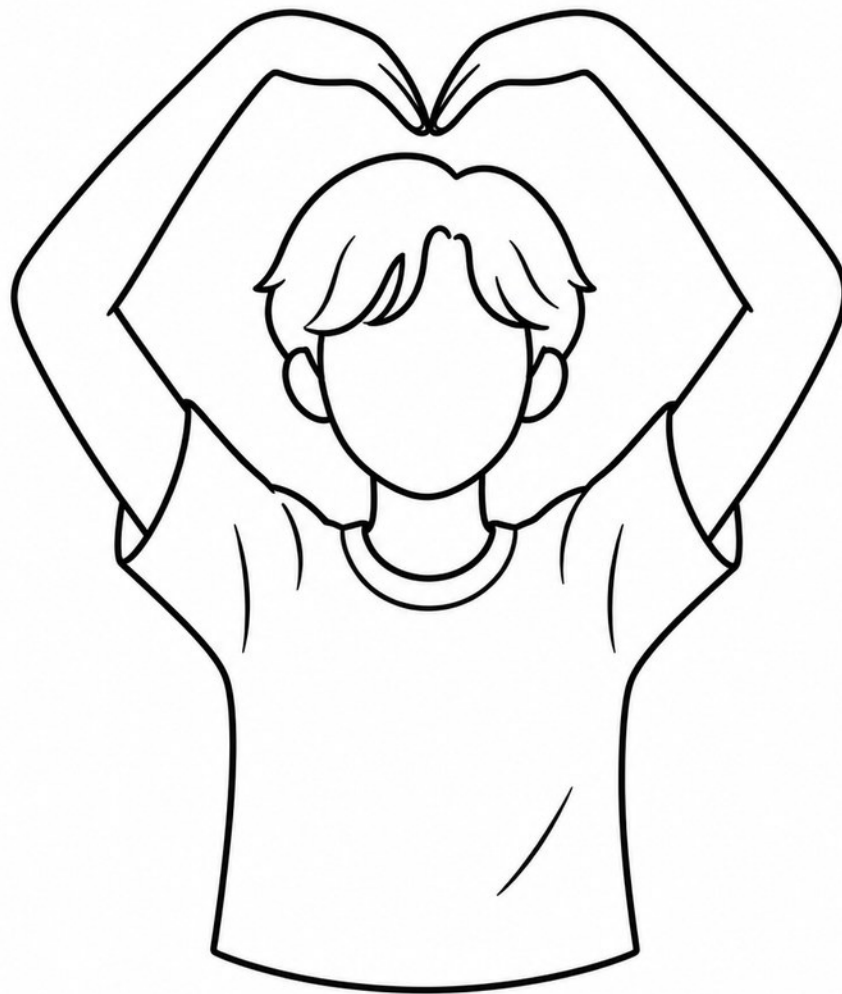
Brown Heart

Comfort, grounded affection and inclusivity.



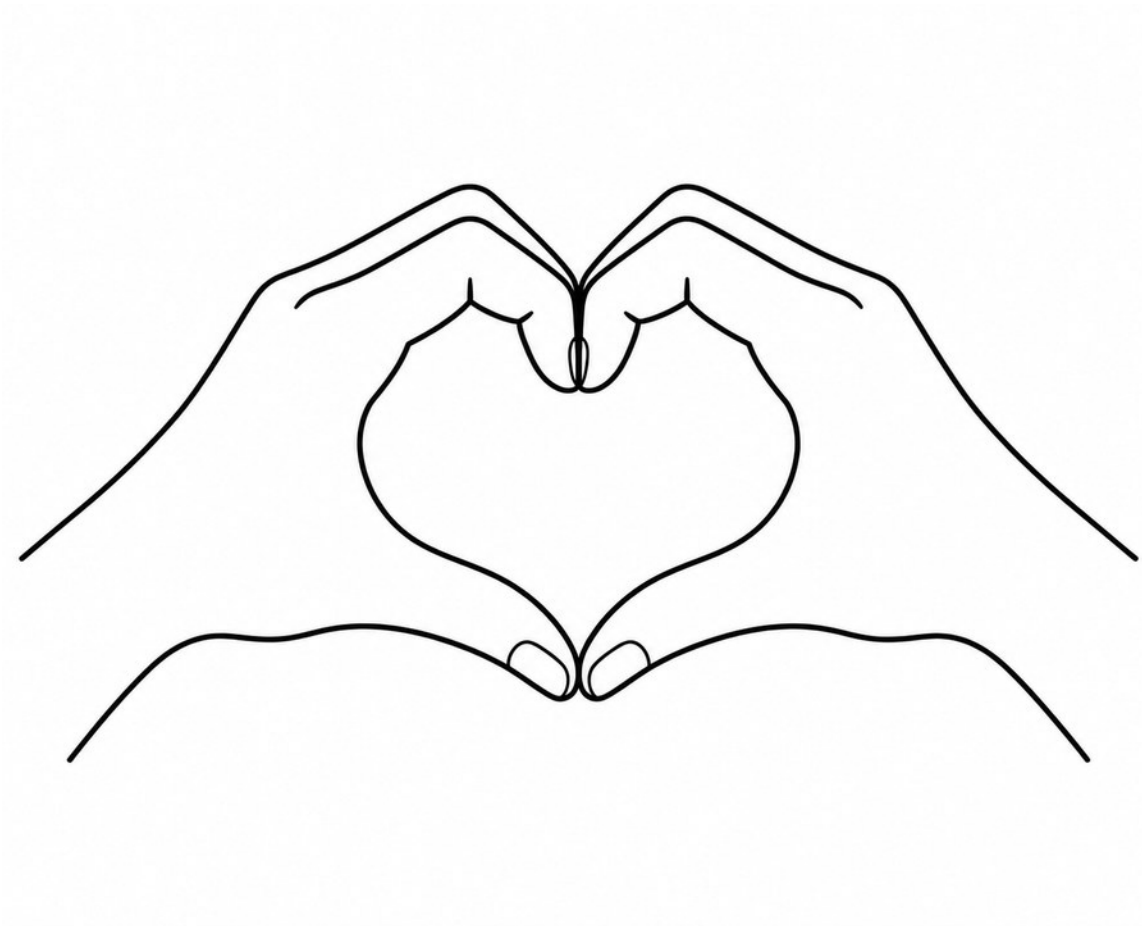
Korean Finger Heart

A tiny 'I love you' from crossed thumb and finger — made famous by K-pop.



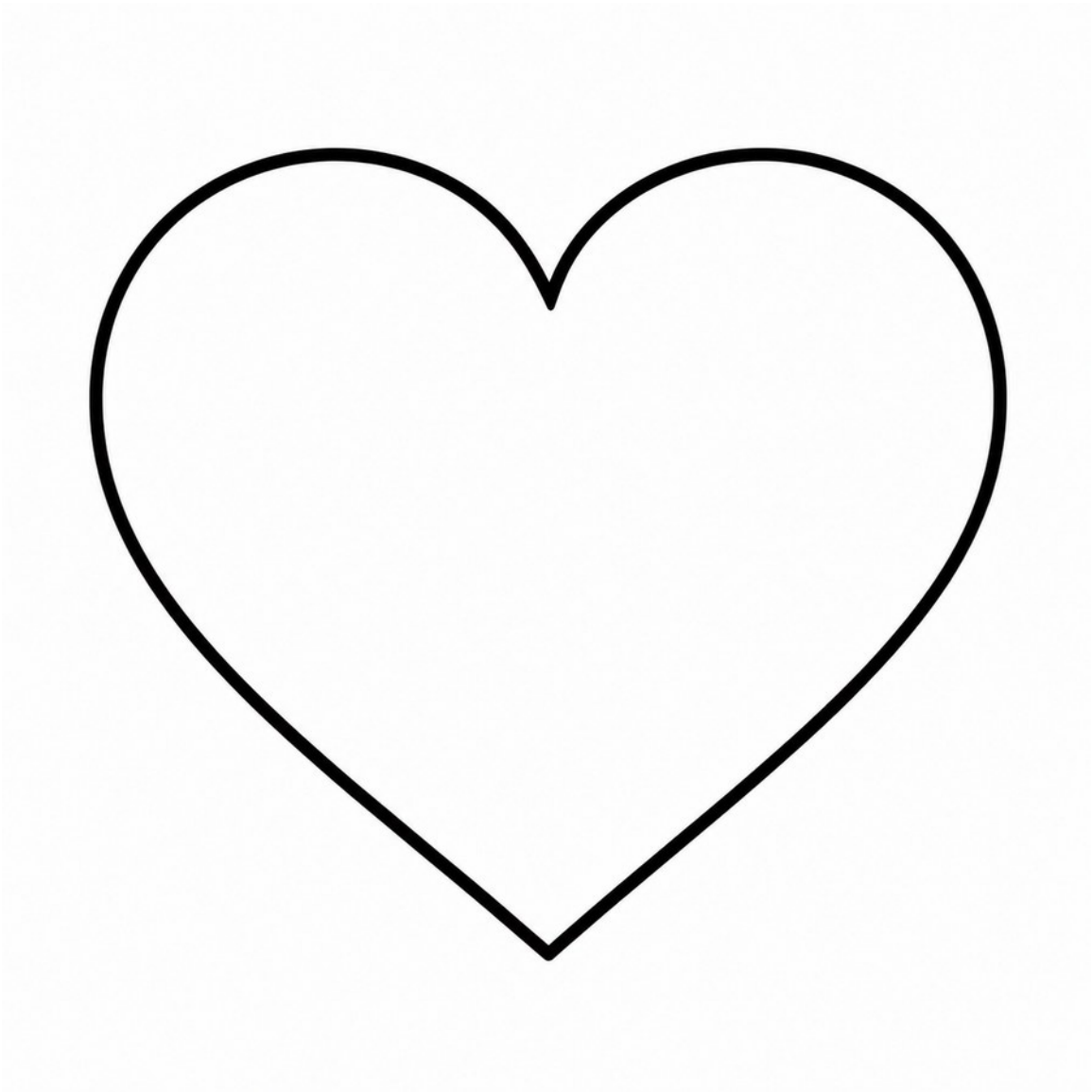
Korean Big Heart

Both arms overhead into a giant heart — 'so much love'.



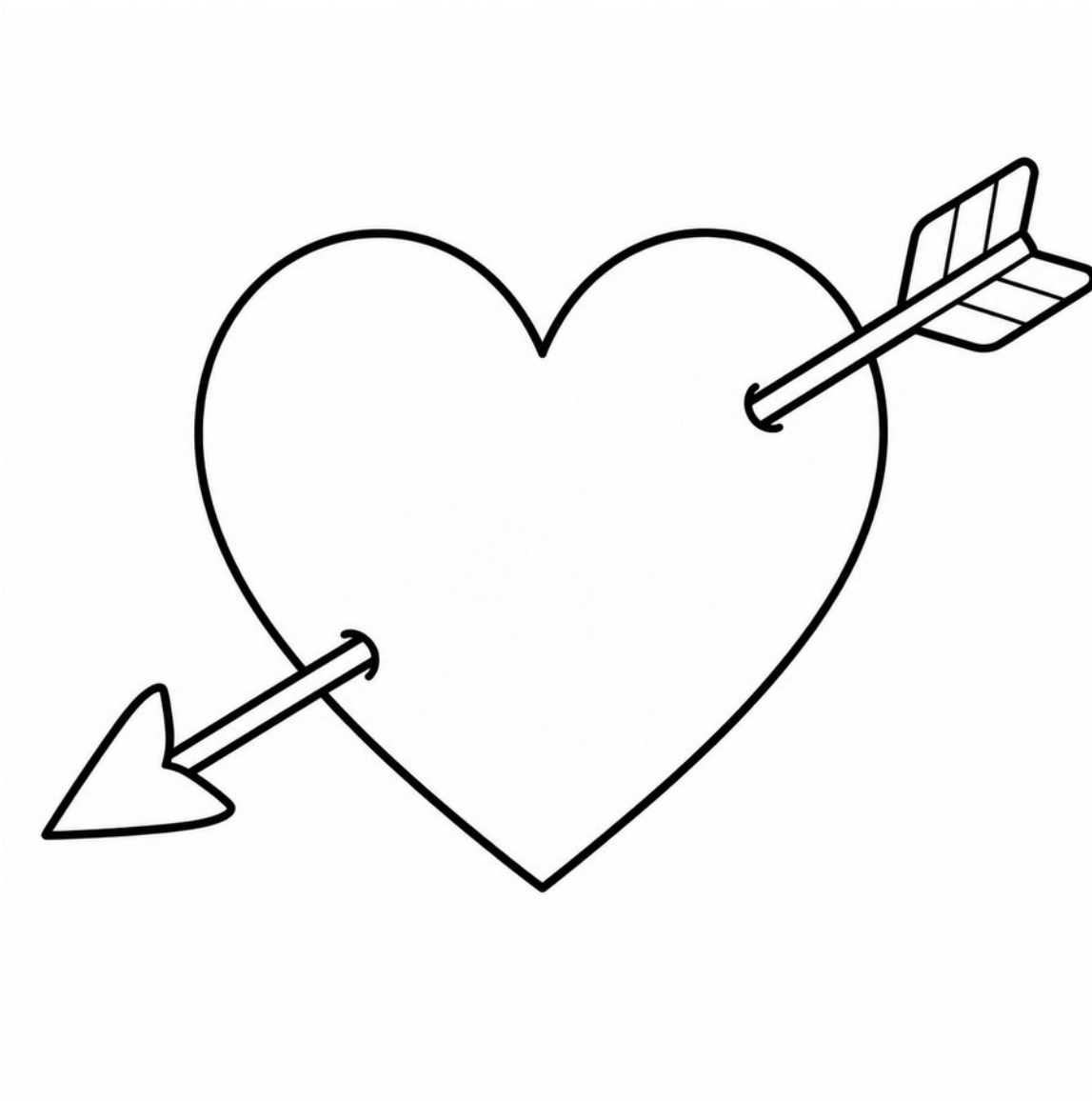
Two-Hand Heart

Two hands forming a heart — a universal way to send love.



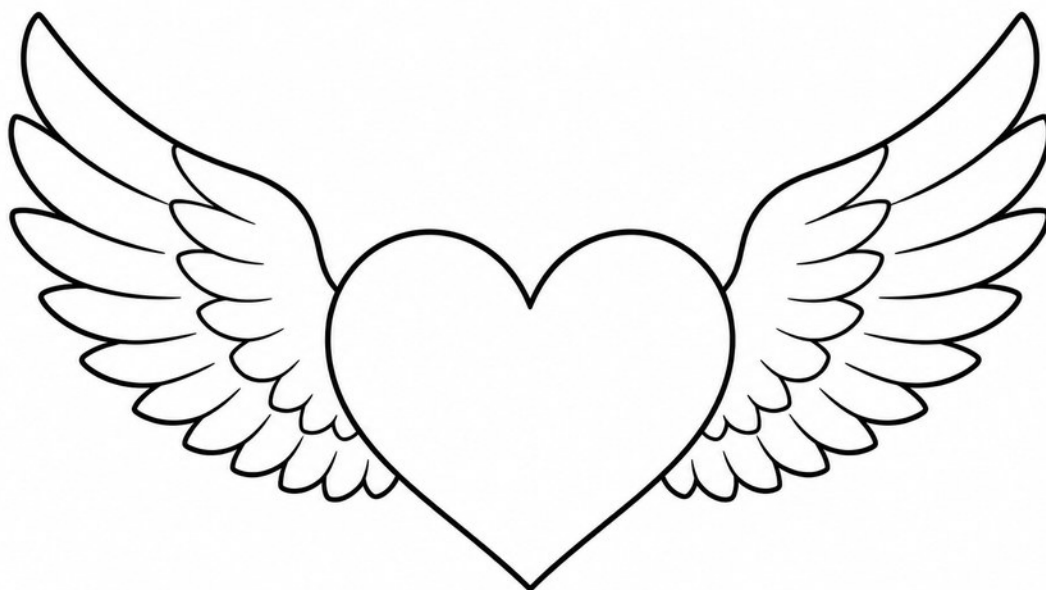
Classic Love Heart

The timeless symmetrical heart — love and affection itself.



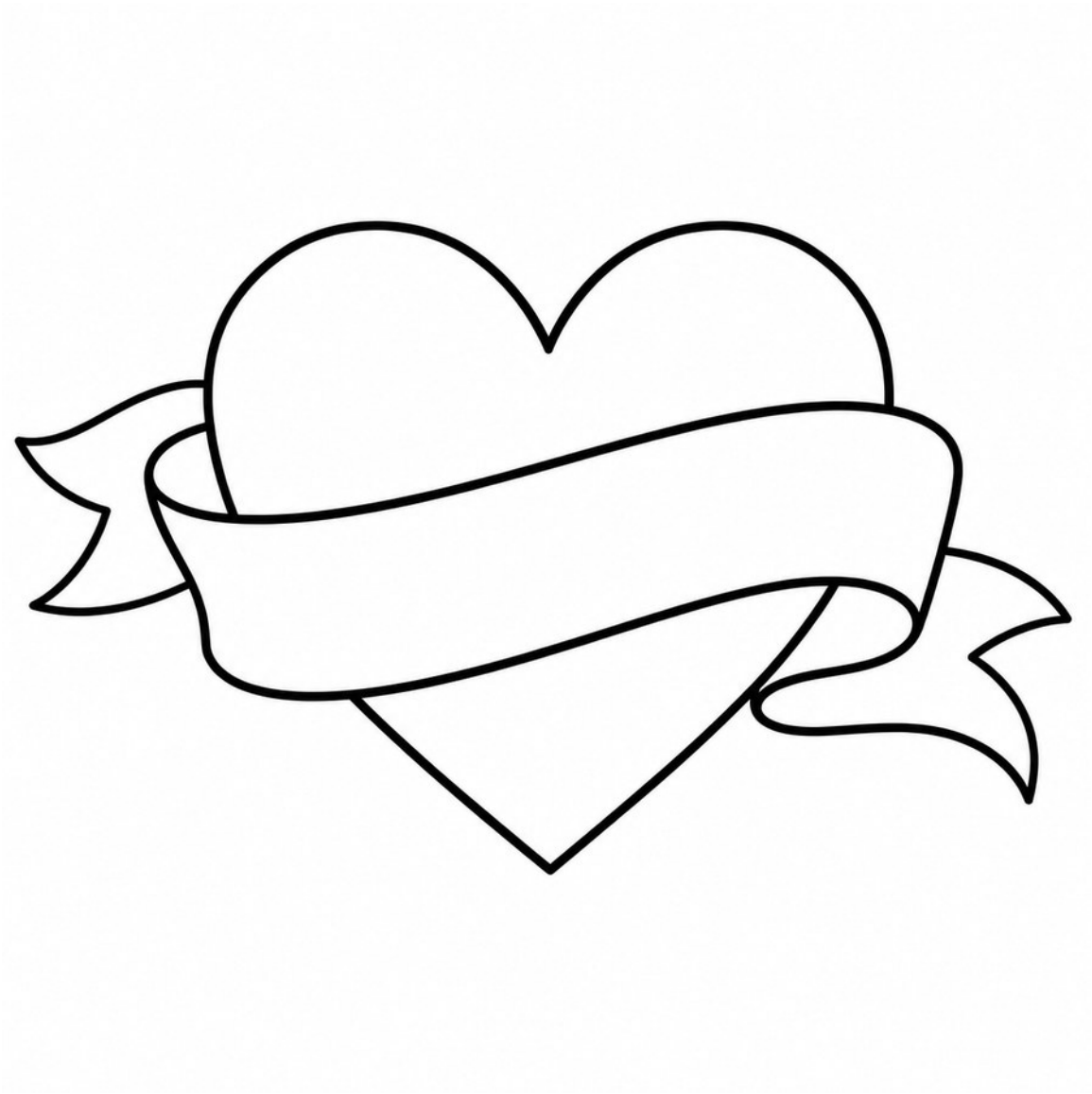
Heart with an Arrow

Cupid's arrow — falling in love, or being struck by it.



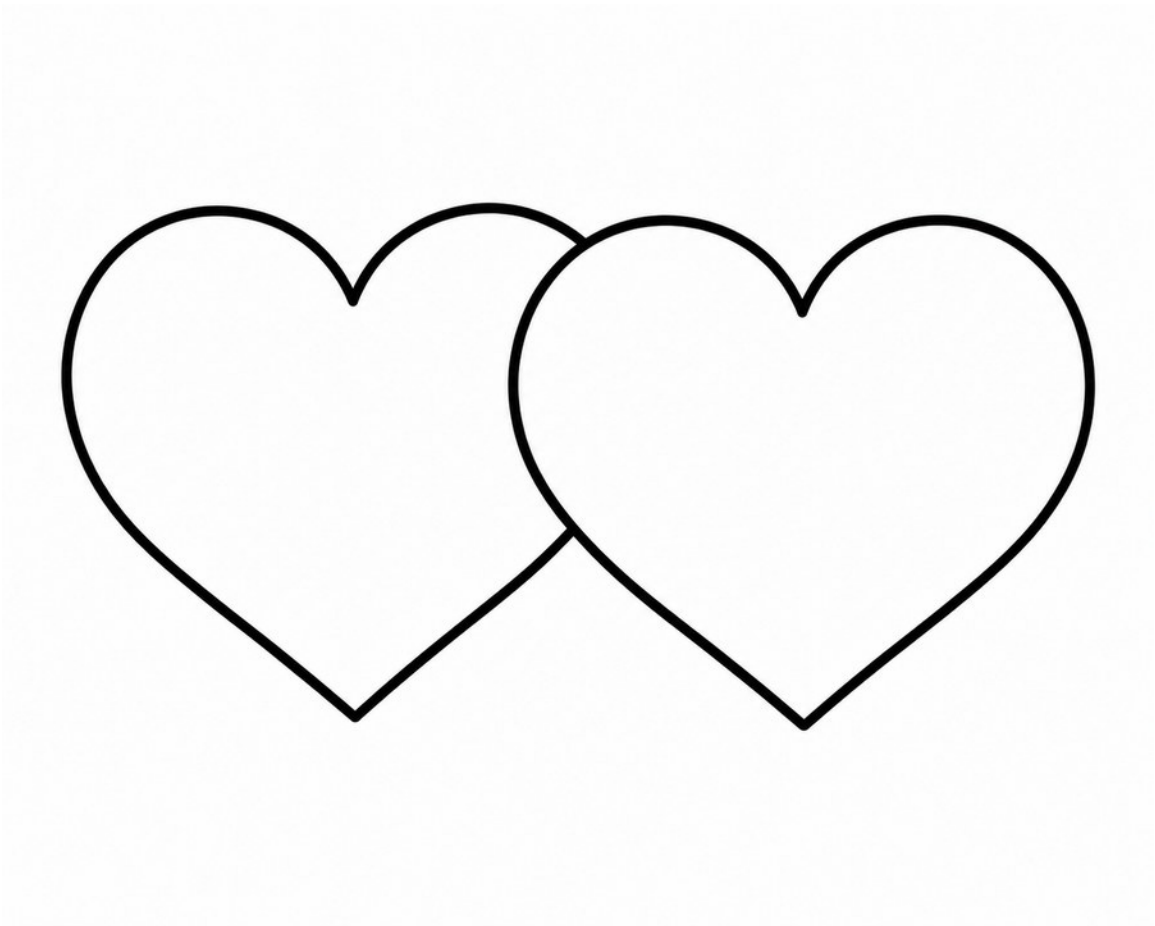
Heart with Wings

Love that soars and feels free — often a tribute to a loved one.



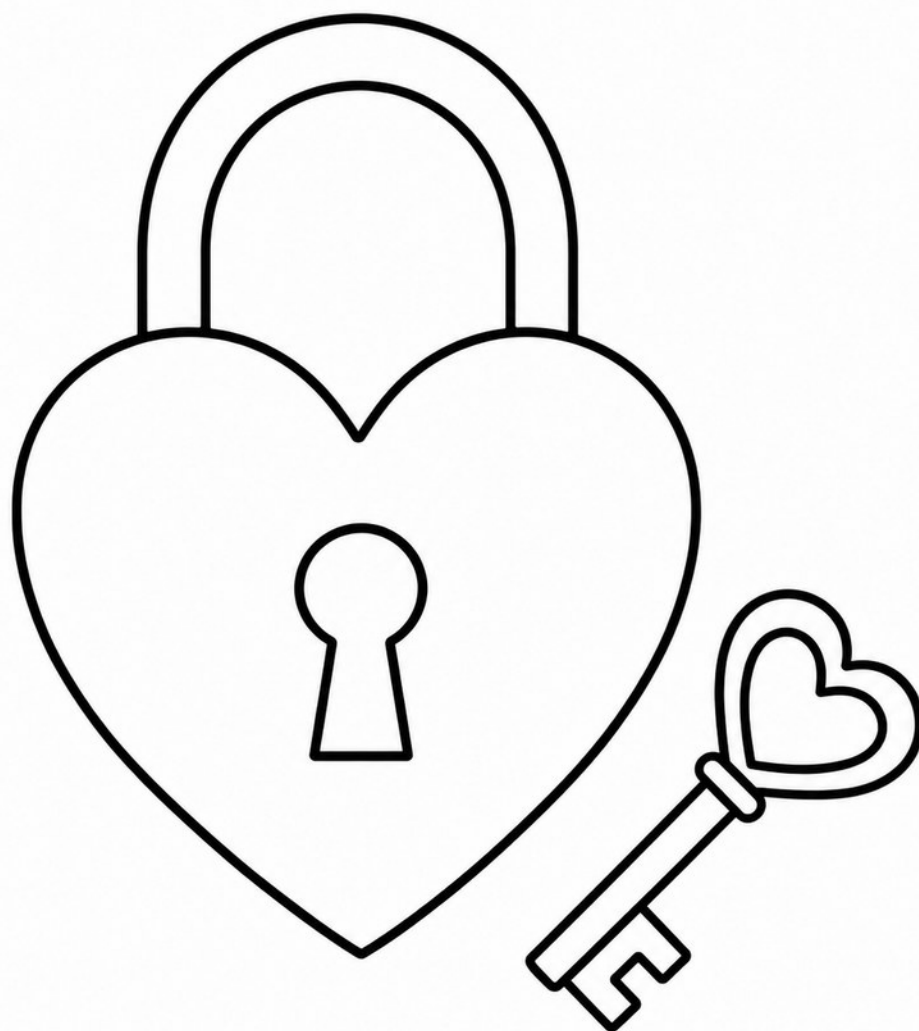
Heart with a Banner

Old-school tattoo devotion — a place to write a name.



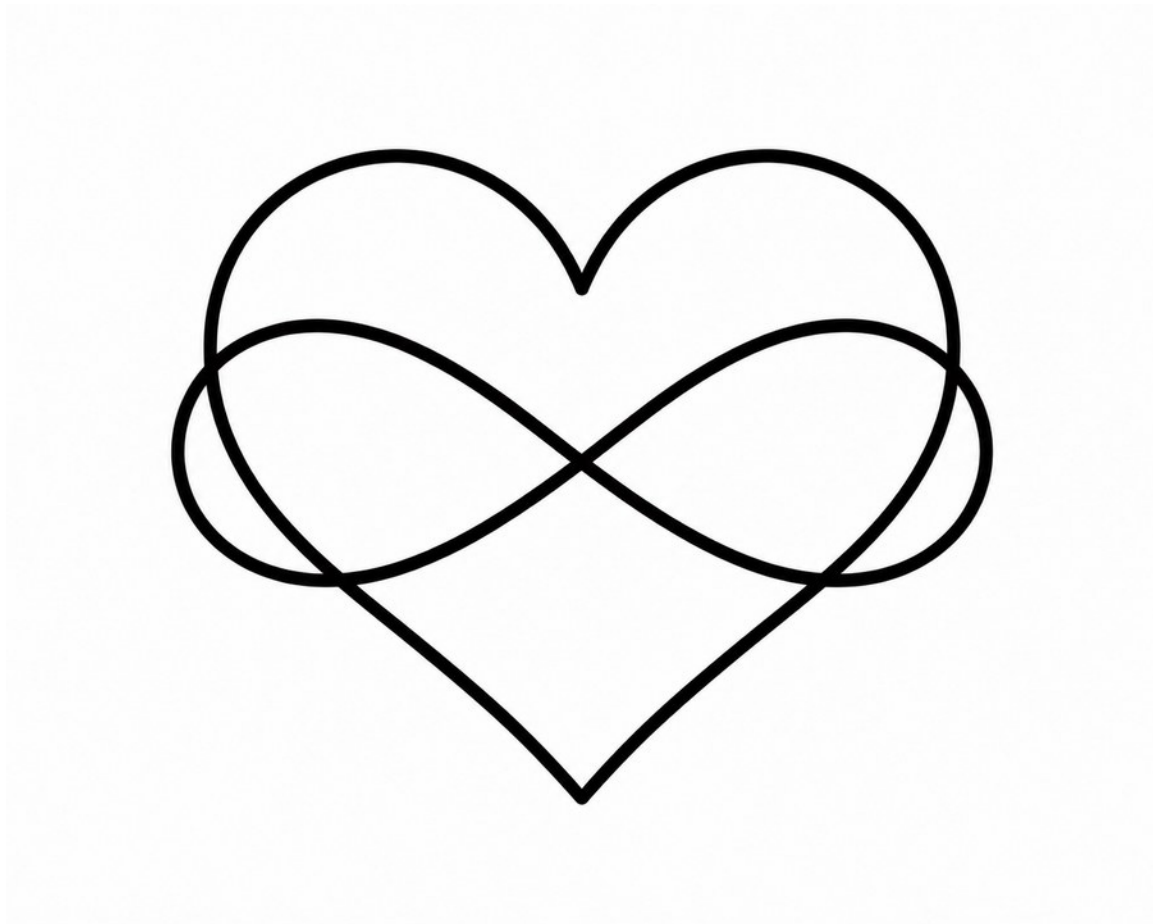
Double Hearts

Mutual love, a couple, two people as one.



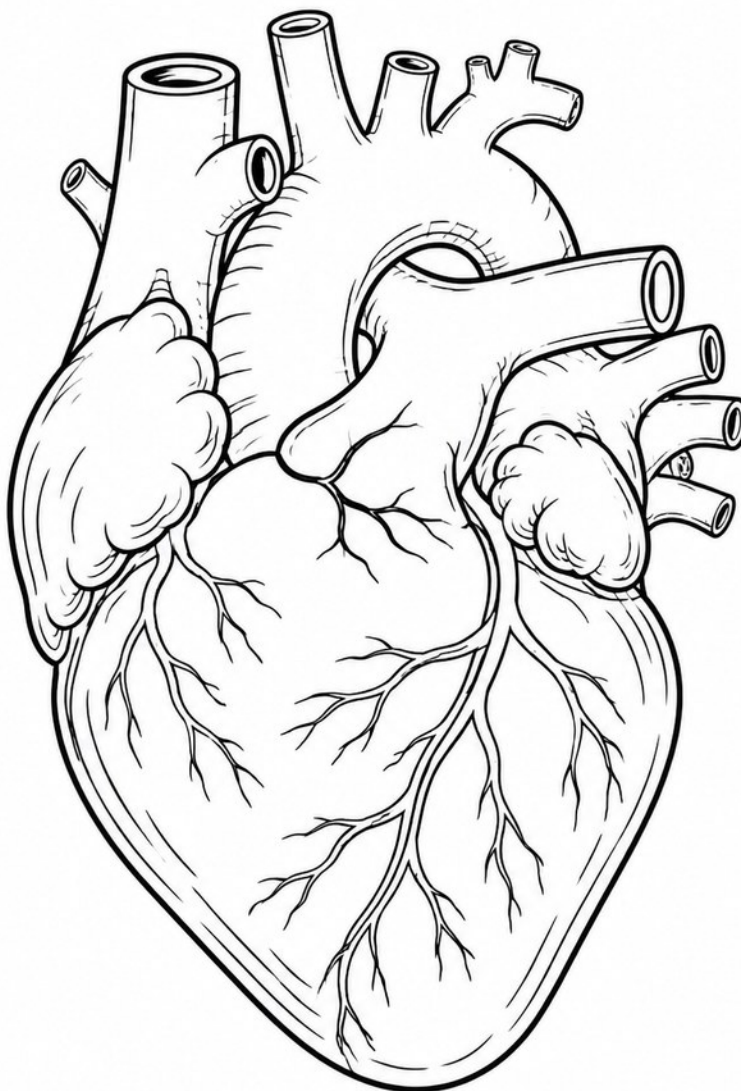
Heart Lock & Key

A heart as an infinity loop — eternal, never-ending love.



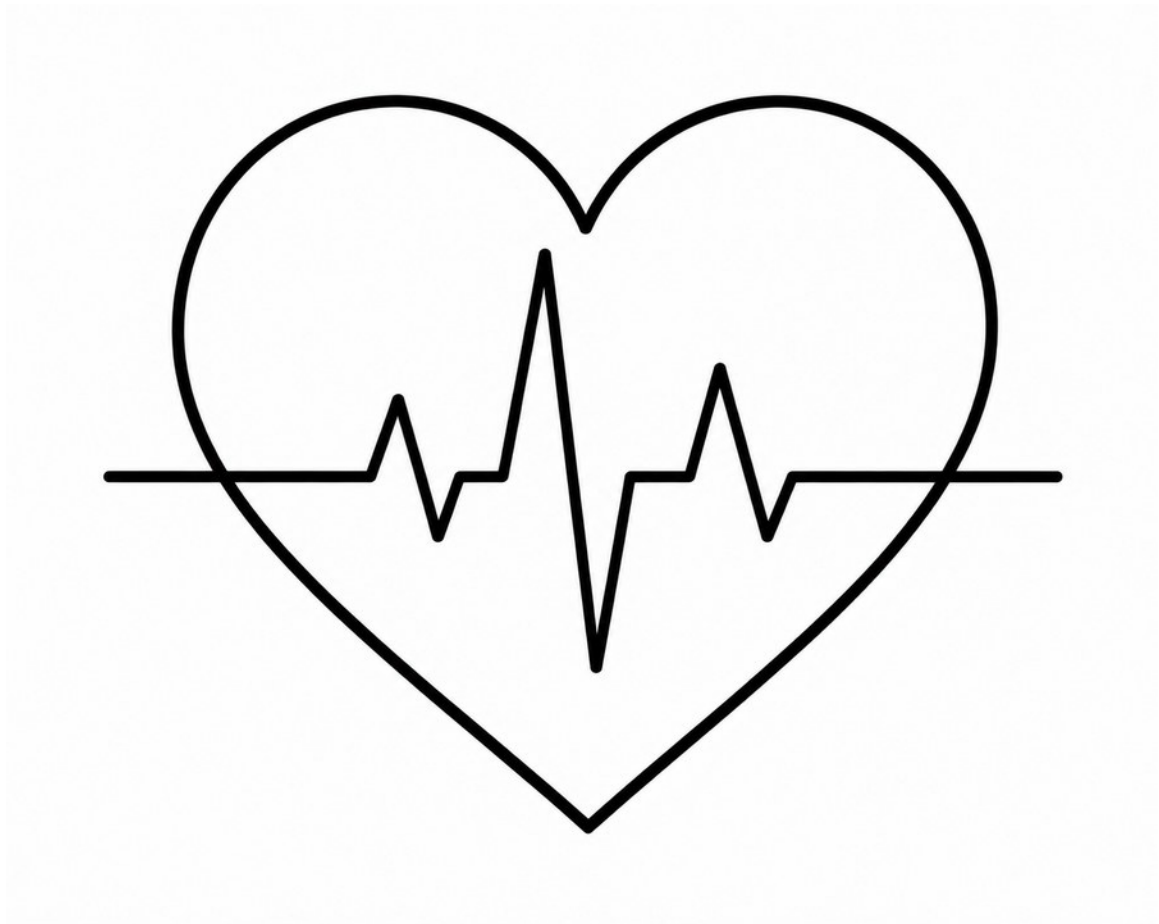
Anatomical Human Heart

The real organ — biology, medicine and whole-hearted love.



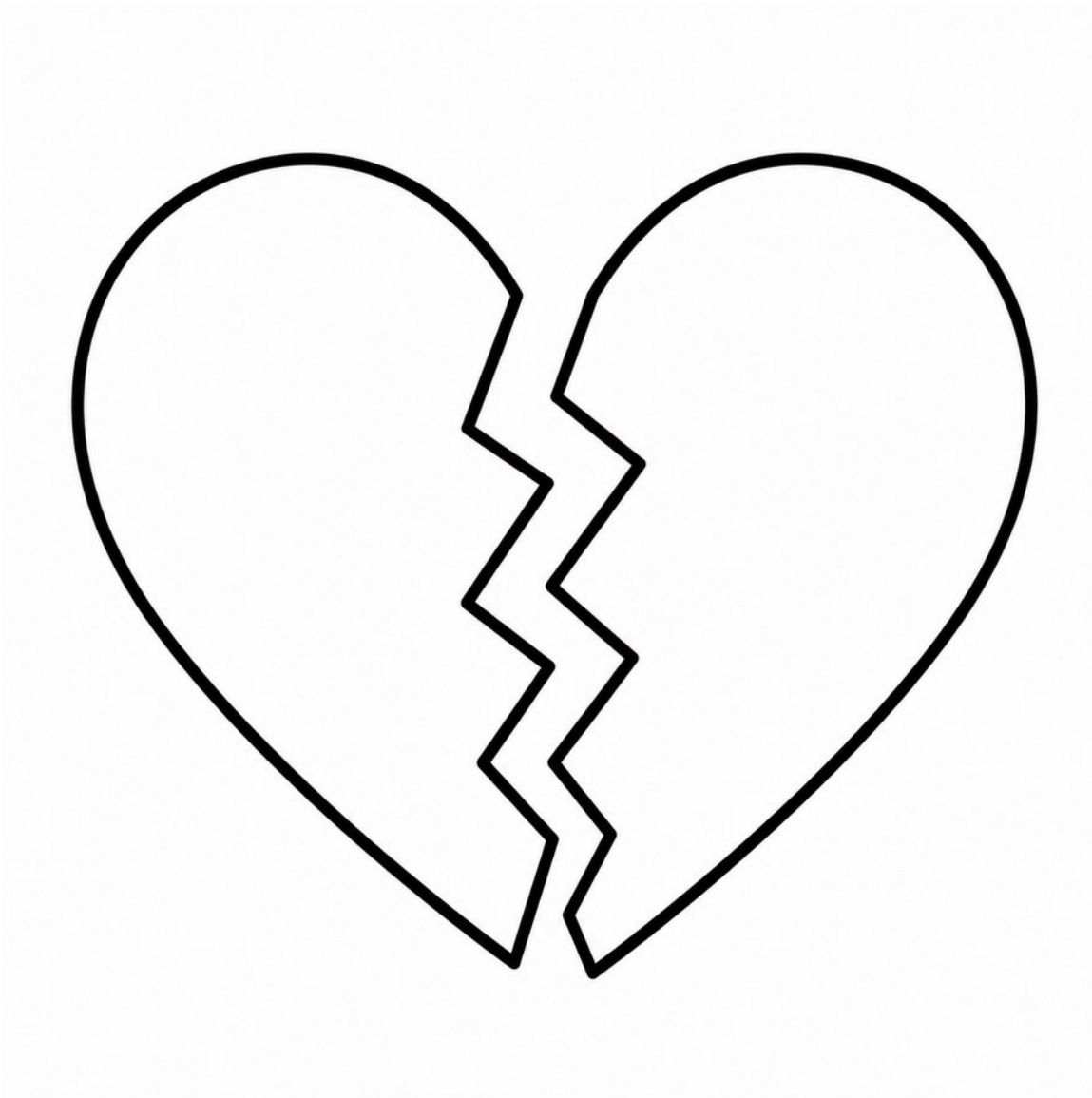
Anatomical Heart with Flowers

Life, health, and 'you make my heart race'.



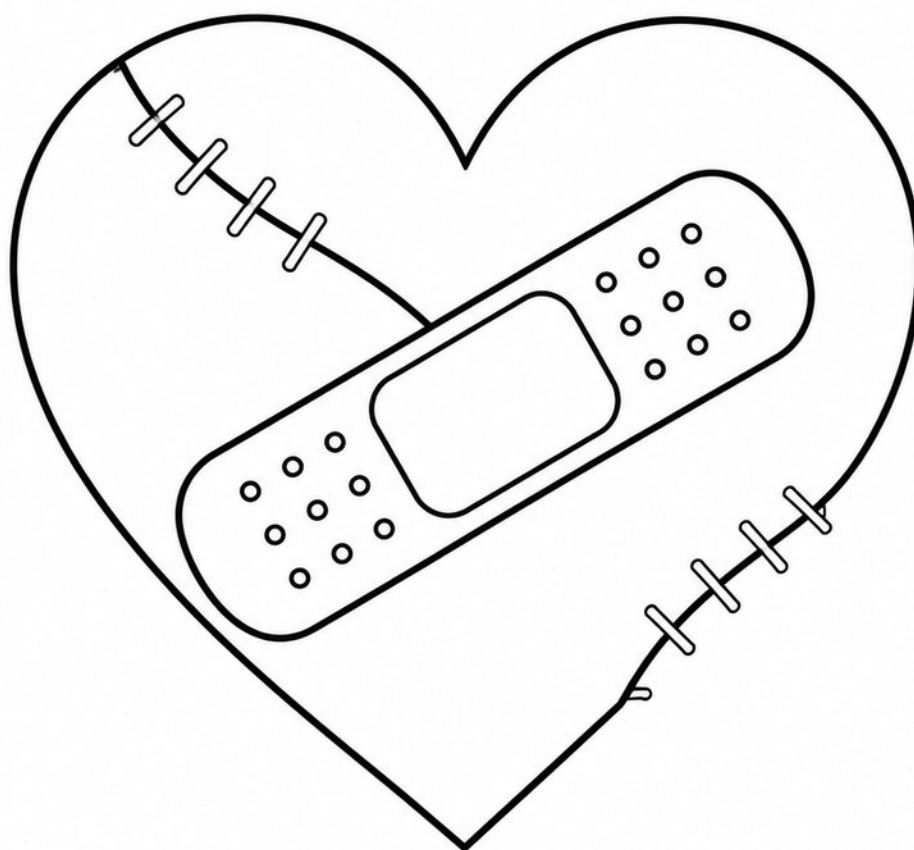
Broken Heart

Recovery — a sign the healing has already begun.



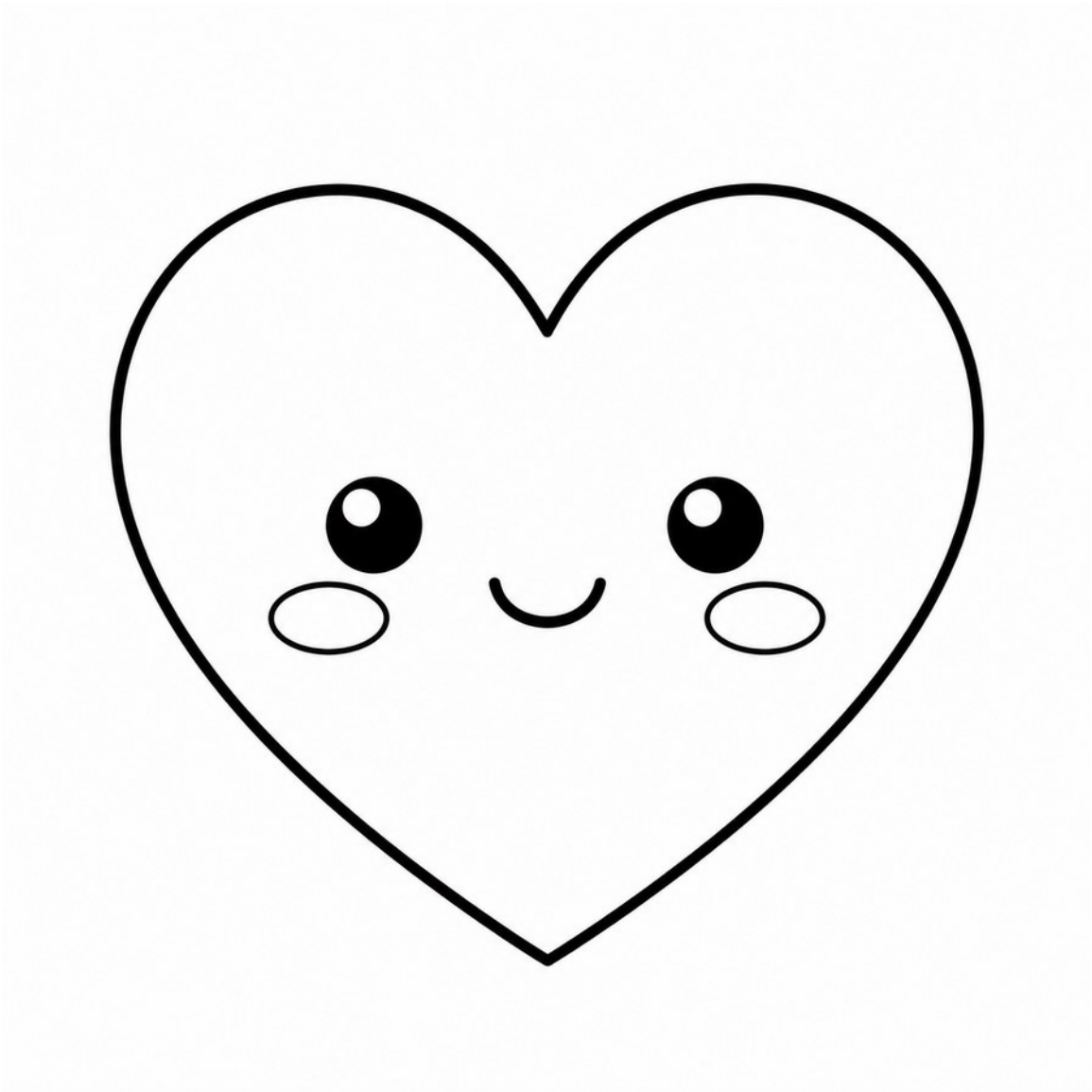
Heart on Fire

Burning passion and intense desire.



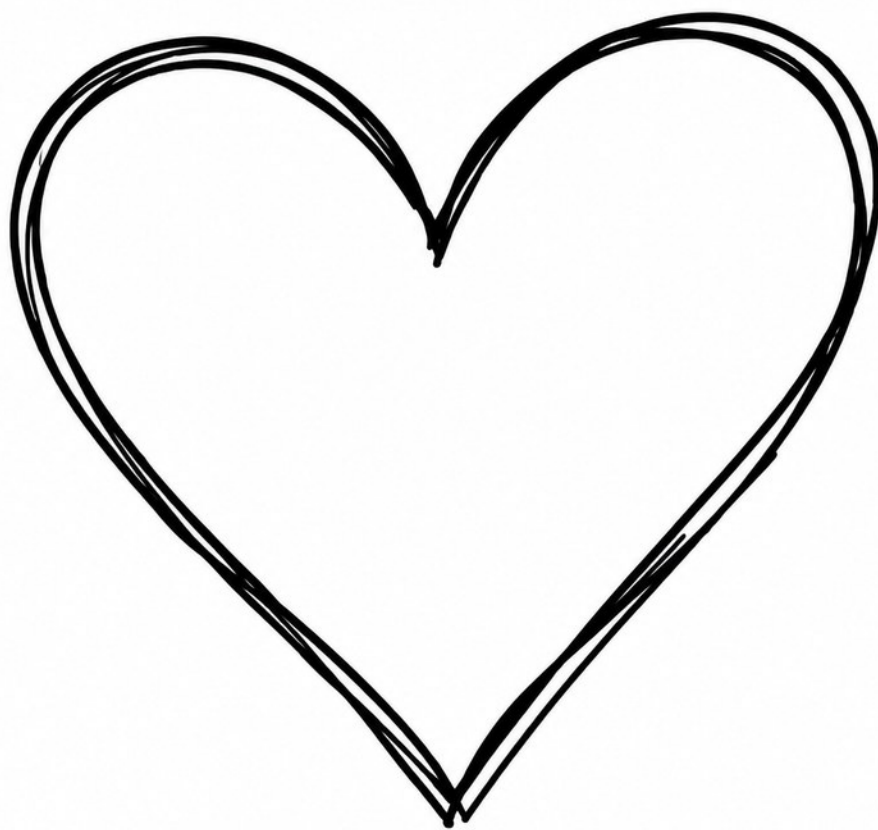
Sparkling Heart

Excitement, joy and a heart that's completely full.



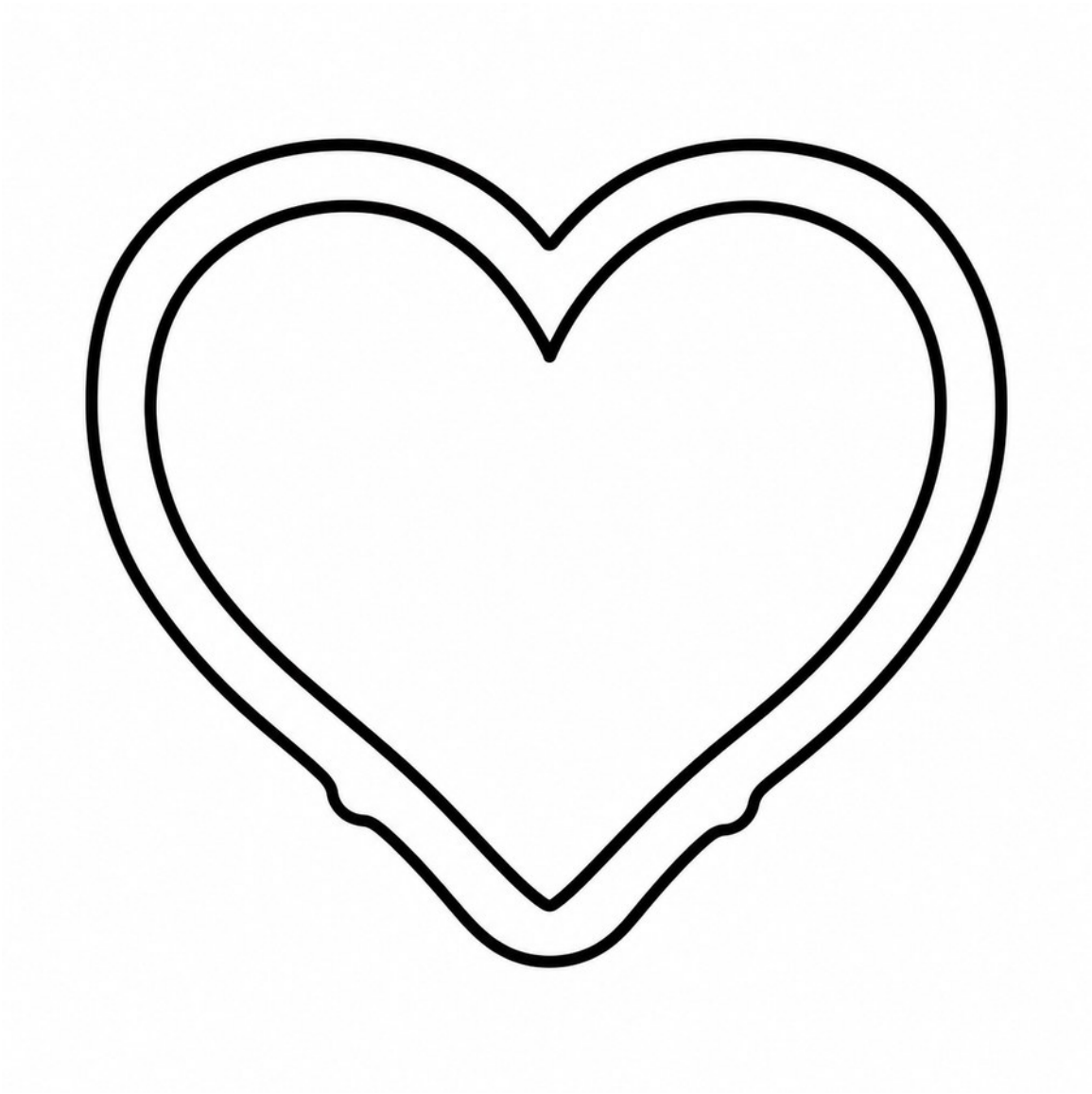
Kawaii Heart

A cute heart with a happy face — wholesome and sweet.



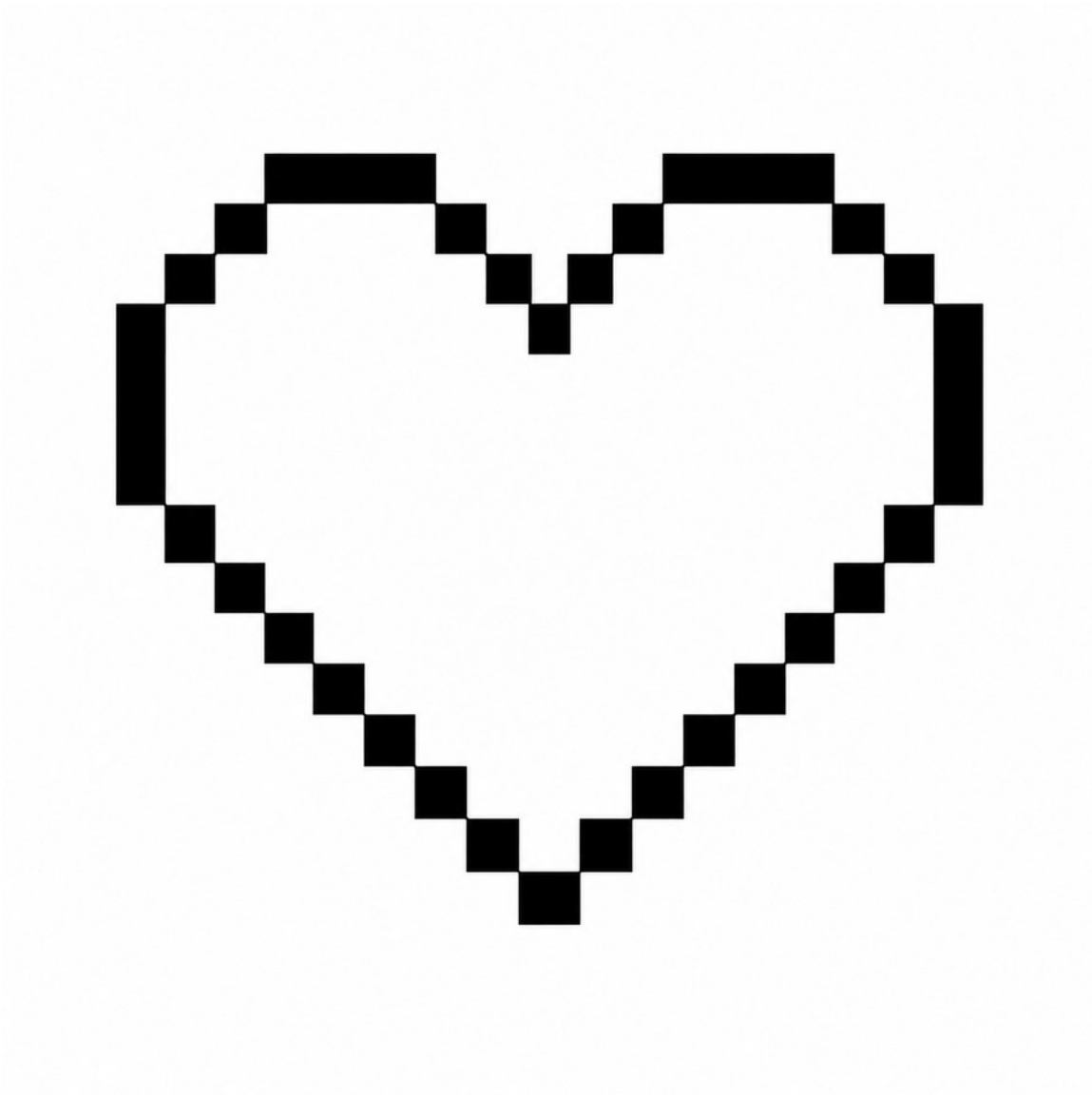
Doodle Heart

A loose scribble heart — casual and 'thinking of you'.



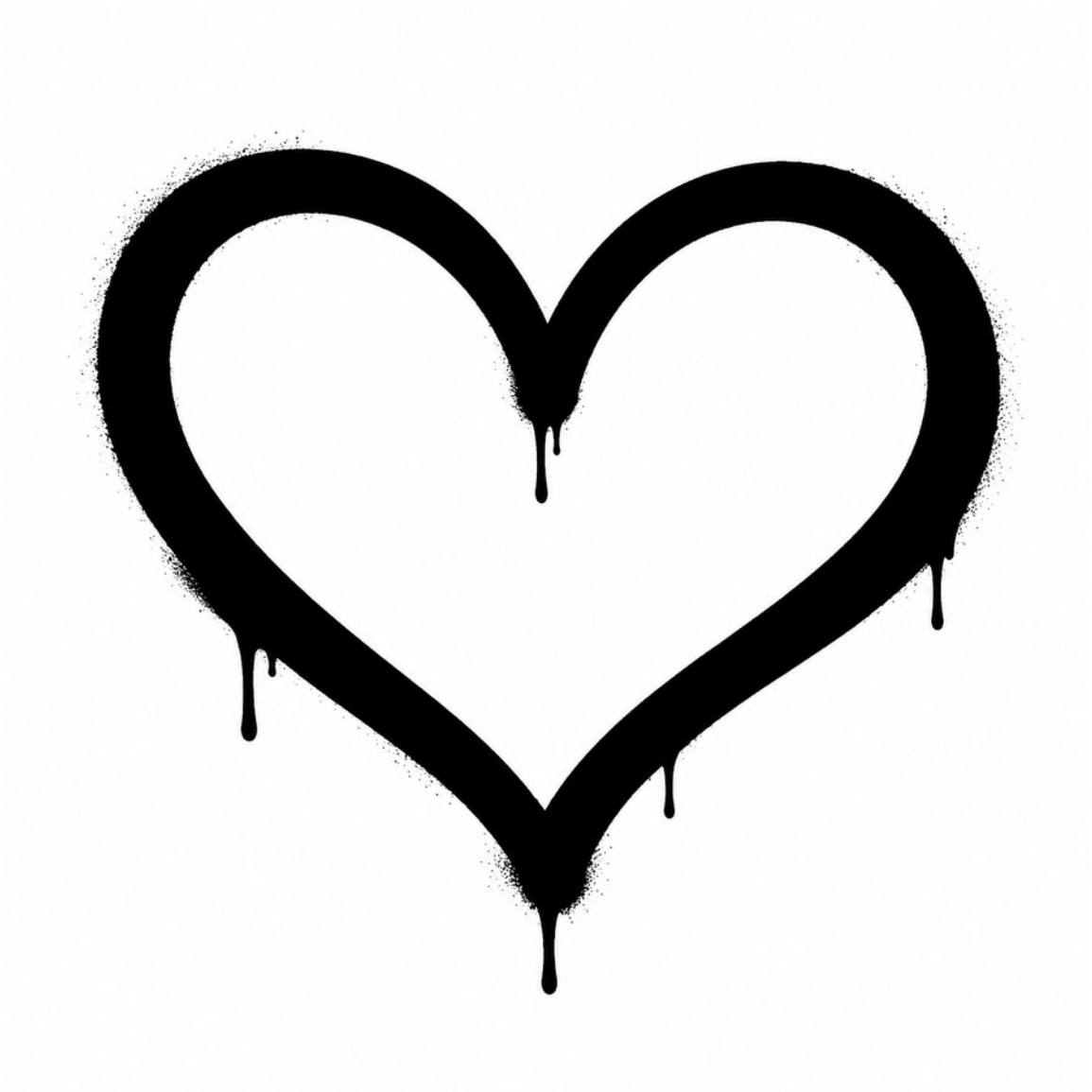
Y2K Heart
